Audition Requirements

Auditions will be held on 15th October, 2022

Two **contrasting** pieces are required:
Beginner to Grade 2 – maximum 5 minutes
Grade 3 to Grade 5 – maximum 7 minutes
Grade 6 and above - maximum 10 minutes

A copy of the sheet music of each piece must be submitted with this application.

Please note: Applicants must have an accompanist to perform pieces with a written accompaniment. The accompanist must be provided with music two weeks prior to the auditions. The cost of rehearsals and the audition are the responsibility of the applicant. Where applicable, the use of technology is allowed. For example, students who have prepared for lower grade AMEB exams where recorded accompaniments are

allowed may use these approved recordings. Electric guitar students may use pedals to create accompanying loops, etc as part of their performance. NB IF RECORDINGS ARE USED, THE AUDITIONING INSTRUMENT MAY NOT REPLICATE AN INSTRUMENT ON THE RECORDING.

Junior scholarships are awarded to primary school students, or those playing Grade 3 and under. Senior scholarships are awarded to secondary students or adults, or those playing Grade 4 and over. Early learners are those in their first two years of study on an instrument.

SCHOLARSHIP TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Please read carefully before signing below.

- 1. Applications must be lodged by the closing date. <u>Late applications will not be accepted.</u>
- 2. Scholarships are open to current students of YRC, and to those people residing in locations where YRC offers tuition.
- 3. Scholarships are open to students of all ages and at all stages of learning for tuition in any area of learning offered by YRC. This includes theory/musicianship; composition; music production, etc
- 4. Applicants must make themselves available for the date and time of the auditions.
- 5. The scholarship auditions will be adjudicated by an independent person with expertise in music education/performance.
- 6. The decision of the adjudicator is final.
- 7. The scholarship auditions will be held at Young Regional Conservatorium, 15-17 Campbell St, Young.
- 8. In cases where there is no suitable applicant, or applicants do not meet the required standard, the scholarship will not be offered.
- 9. Only the candidate and accompanist will be allowed in the audition room.
- 10. Applicants arriving late will forfeit their audition.
- 11. Applicants may audition on more than one instrument.
- 12. Staff members are ineligible to apply for scholarships, but their family members are eligible.
- 13. Scholarships are awarded on a yearly basis. A student may only receive one scholarship per year. A student may be awarded the same scholarship for 2 consecutive years only. They will not be eligible to apply in the 3rd consecutive year. They can, however, apply for a scholarship again after a one-year break, or for a scholarship on a different instrument.
- 14. YRC reserves the right to withdraw a scholarship at any time that conditions are not met, or if the scholarship holder's behaviour is viewed as detrimental to the school.
- 15. The scholarships are dependent on funding from external bodies. YRC reserves the right to withdraw scholarships should funding not be received.
- 16. In extraordinary circumstances, with CEO approval, a student may submit a video in lieu of live audition.
- 17. Requirements: Scholarship holders must be available on the following dates:
 - YRC annual awards and presentation ceremony: Sunday December 11, 2022, Young
 - St Patrick's Day Concert (performance): Friday, March 17, 2023, Young
 - Scholarship Holders Concert (performance): Sunday 17 September, 2023, Young
 - 2023 annual awards and presentation ceremony
 - Scholarship holders must always give priority to attending scheduled lessons and notify the YRC office where attendance is genuinely impossible. (In this case, lessons may be made up in accordance with the normal procedures).
 - Scholarship holders must pay 50% of the standard 30-minute tuition fee for their auditioned
 instrument and the Annual Membership Fee. Scholarship holders are strongly encouraged to
 commit to any relevant YRC ensemble groups or assist with piano accompanying (as
 appropriate), and may enter one practical exam at no cost.
 - Scholarship holders will be invited to compere ONE student concert throughout the year, with assistance from their tutor.
